AFJROTC Advisers: Lt.Col. Coulouras, MSgt Sullivan

AFJROTC stands for Air Force Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps. It is a military regulated high school program whose purpose is to educate high school students in leadership roles while making them aware of the benefits of citizenship. The mission of JROTC is to motivate young people to become better American citizens.
